
Editorial Workflow

Editor is notified via email


Draft Article Draft approved by editor

Article is published and visible to visitors




What is an editorial workflow?

The more players and stages, the more complicated the workflow





Most popular stand-alone options:

- Workflow (12,260 sites)
- Workbench Moderation (8,826 sites)
- Revisioning (7,891 sites)



Rules

Pros:

- Flexible
- Customizable
- Multi-purpose module

Cons:

- Needs to be configured
- Requires additional modules to use revisions

Revisioning

Pros:

- Quick setup
- Works with Rules, Workflow, and Diff

Cons:

- Only the latest revision may be edited or moderated.
- Needs additional modules for notification & flow

Pros:

- Allows multiple workflows
- Customizable
- Optional workflow field
- Works with Revisioning,
 Diff, and Rules

Cons:

- Requires configuration
- Only the latest revision may be edited or moderated.

Workbench Moderation

Pros:


- Quickest to set up
- Built in testing
- Customizable
- Integration with Rules

Cons:

- Default notifications aren't flexible
- Only the latest revision may be edited or moderated.
- One flow configuration for all content types



Workbench Moderation





State Machine

Pros

- Integrates with Workbench Moderation and Rules
- Definable as a custom module
- Programmatic construction

Cons

Programmatic construction

Bonus little add-on that will help editors approve content changes faster.





Workflow Configuration

Step 1: Define the jobs

Create/Edit

Review/Publish

Delete

But it could be more complicated, with multiple stages of editing and review



Workflow Configuration

Step 2: Create the Roles

Contributor

Editor

Manager

Can be as fine-tuned as needed - blog editor, news contributor, etc.



Workflow Configuration

Step 3: Setting Permissions

For each role, set the content permissions and transition permissions.

PERMISSION	BLOG CONTRIBUTOR
Article: Create new content	
Article: Edit own content	
Article: Edit any content	
Article: Delete own content	
Article: Delete any content	
Blog Post: Create new content	⋖
Blog Post: Edit own content	⋖
Blog Post: Edit any content	
Blog Post: Delete own content	
Blog Post: Delete any content	

Arguments Against Editorial Workflow

- Adds bulk
 Standard equation of cost vs gain applies
- Does not include dynamic content
 Other content that might display on the page is not tracked.
 - Core provides revision history
